Sixteenth Sunday

First Reading: The hospitality shown by Abraham and Sarah is rewarded with the gift of their child, Isaac, even though they were both of advanced years. Generous and hospitable people are blessed by God in mysterious ways.

Second Reading: St Paul entered the mystery of Christ by sharing in his suffering.

Gospel: Martha and Mary, both friends of Jesus (he stayed at their house in Bethany when making pilgrimages to Jerusalem), show two aspects of Christian living: Mary spends time in prayer, listening to the Lord; while Martha does good work. We can strike a balance between contemplation and action.
