Thirty Third Sunday Christ our hope of life eternal.

First Reading: The prophet Malachi describes the day of judgement as a decisive moment in world history. Evil doers will be reduced, while those who have put their trust in the Lord will be saved.

Second Reading: The people of Thessalonica expect the Parousia (second coming of the Mesiah) imminently. St Paul encourages them to keep on going about their ordinary responsibilities in the meantime.

Gospel: The Gospel of Luke was written soon after the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem (70AD); Jerusalem had been laid to waste by a Roman Legion ("not a single stone left on another"); The first Christians were also being persecuted as the Gospel was written ("You will be hated on account of my name."). Whatever the challenging circumstances of our lifetimes, we are invited to remain faithful to the Lord Jesus.
