Second Reading: St Paul tells the Romans that should treat each other in the same friendly way as "Christ treated you."

Gospel: John the Baptist is a fearsome figure, especially critical of the Pharisees, who don't practice what they preach. He prepares a way for the Messiah by his uncluttered lifestyle and by sharing his faith openly. A Children's Liturgy of the Word will take place at Masses this weekend The sacrament of reconciliation is celebrated at 6.30pm on Saturdays in the Reconciliation Room of Killavullen Church or at any time requested.

Longing for truth, we turn to you:

- o John the Baptist's message is a stark call to "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." He condemns the religious leaders' empty reliance on their privileged ancestry. *Is your faith a matter of genuine transformation, producing a 'fruitful' life or purely external?*
- o John's role was to prepare the way for the Lord, making 'straight paths for him'. This involves honest self-examination. What 'mountains' of pride or 'valleys' of apathy in my life need to be levelled to make a clear, unobstructed path for God's kingdom to reign?
- O John speaks of the coming Messiah who will 'baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire." Fire refines and purges. What is in our lives that needs the Holy Spirit's purifying fire?
- The image of the winnowing fork, used at harvest time, is one of ultimate separation and accountability. It reminds us that our choices have eternal consequences. Does the reality of final judgment influence my daily decisions and my desire to live a good life characterized by fidelity and integrity? (Intercom, Dec. 2025)
