### Trinity Sunday

*First Reading:* As Moses and the people did when they received the Ten Commandments, so we gather today to worship the God who is “slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness.”

*Second Reading:* St Paul’s letter to Corinth includes one of the very few references to God as Trinity in the New Testament (v. 13)

*Gospel:* The salvation offered to us by God has been made visible in Jesus Christ. With him at our side, we can find our way to God.

**How can God be one being, but also three?** The Mystery of the Trinity - that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are all equally and fully God, yet are not three but one God, is never set out formally in the Bible. Yet within a few centuries, Church leaders were clearly stating what was written between the lines in the scriptures. The Nicene Creed, which we recite on most Sunday, dates from as early as 325AD and refers to God the father as our creator; Jesus Christ as the one who has redeemed our fallen world and the Holy Spirit as the “Lord, the giver of life” the presence of God with us today. In the Trinity we worship the one God who is made known to us in three different ways. Every Mass is a prayer of thanksgiving to God, the origin of all that is good and our reason for hope.
