Eleventh Sunday

First Reading: God had liberated his people from slavery in Egypt and now he wants to make a Covenant to seal the relationship. As Christians, we believe that the covenant has been extended to all humanity in Christ. He has freed us from sin and death.

Psalms 99: A song of praise to God.

Second Reading: St Paul's letter to the first Christians in Rome is a summary of his theology. At the appointed time, God's Son came to show us the way to the Father.

Gospel: The 12 tribes of Israel are symbolically represented by the 12 apostles, the cornerstone of a new Israel. Jesus sends his disciples to share in his work of reconciliation and redemption.
